123rd ANNUAL EXHIBITION

9th-16th SEPTEMBER

The Private View must have been one of our busiest ever! Both exhibition rooms were packed with members and guests. What a social occasion! This meant that many guests came back the following days to have a good look at all the artwork on display.

Many compliments were made about the standard of work, hanging etc. It is always a challenge to give the modern gallery "Haslemere Room" and the traditional Lecture Hall their own identity with the great variety of art.

Many thanks to all who contributed, Rachel and her hanging team for a great job, June and Neil Covey for producing the catalogue. It all helped to make this year's Exhibition such a success!

In total 331 items were entered (2016: 288), 47 items sold (2016: 39) and 96 cards. Total sales £4550 (2016: £3114). Wendy Rapley sold most (7) of her entered work and even had enquiries for more of her limited edition etching of the small "Hare".

Allan Thomson was delighted to go round the Exhibition and chose Clare Bowen as the winner of the Allan Thomson Prize with her painting of the Georgian Hotel. Our Mayor Malcolm Carter was very pleased to present the prize, a £50 voucher towards art materials, sponsored by the HAS.





Clare was one of the "Painting in Town" artists and it shows what a few hours painting in the High Street can produce! Clare won "Highly Commended" in the Artists Magazine competition of the year and hopes to show at the Royal Institute of Oil Painters at the Mall Galleries. Congratulations Clare!

The winners of the "favourite" vote were Sheila Carr with her abstract painting "Landscape and Sky", a new direction in painting for Sheila and David Paynter with his beautiful sculpture "Father and Son" accompanied by a very moving poem.





All in all, this has been a very successful Exhibition, enjoyed by members and visitors, and it shows what talent we have in our very active Society!

We will do it all again next year, but in the meantime please join us for the various talks, demonstrations, or you might like to take part in a workshop!
