
Welcome to our Newsletter and an introduction to our new Website!

On behalf of the HAS I have gifted the first Minute book from 1897 to the Library of the Museum, together with two beautifully printed catalogues of Exhibitions in 1922 and later. In the museum's library they are safe and easy to access for the general public to see what went on in the HSA (Haslemere Society of Artists) over 100 years ago.





We should all be proud that more than 100 years later we are still here as the HAS.

Museum Exhibition 9th May - 24th June

The Museum has asked us to draw attention to their Exhibition "A Golden Era", 1859-1914. "A selection of paintings and illustrations by many of the artists who flocked to the Haslemere area following the arrival of the railway. It highlights not only the diversity of these artists' work but also by 1894 this artistic community supported the foundation of the Haslemere Society of Artists which flourishes today as the Haslemere Art Society."

On the 2nd June our Honorary President, Roger Dellar ROI PS RI, who is also patron of the museum will give a demonstration painting a local landscape /townscape. Museum and HAS members £5, non members £10.
